1. All individuals working with or providing care to vertebrate animals and cephalopods must complete the following CITI modules: (1) Working with the IACUC, (2) Reducing Pain and Distress in Laboratory Mice and Rats, and (3) SIUC Animal Care. A surgery module must be completed if performing surgery. Additional taxa specific modules may be required.

2. Once expired, individuals need only take the single refresher course titled: Working with Animals in Biomedical Research - Refresher Course.

3. The term "Investigators" refers to all PD/PI and any other person regardless of title or position, who is responsible for the design, conduct, or reporting of the funded research. PIs are responsible for ensuring all required personnel on their grant who must take FCOI and/or RCR training have done so.
